About the role

We are currently seeking a part time (14-25 hours/week) Psychotherapist or Social Worker with a specialty in Emotionally Focused Therapy (EFT). Reporting into the Clinical Director, the position will offer psychotherapy to individuals and couples through our Shalem Counselling Clinic in Hamilton, ON.

The ideal candidate will be able to work independently and also be part of a clinical team, using strength-based models, working respectfully with diverse clientele; balancing support and accountability; and being adaptable and flexible while managing client situations.

Key Responsibilities

- Provide counselling to individuals and couples
- Work effectively with couples using Emotionally Focussed Therapy when appropriate
- Conduct intake sessions and individual, couple and family sessions in alignment with internal policies and those outlined in applicable standards guidelines
- Document all client engagements as per legislative requirements, adhering to the agency's documentation requirements and timelines.
- Maintain client folders in a manner aligned with the expectations of internal policy and applicable governing bodies
- Participate in regular paid supervision, training, and team meetings
- Participate in discussions pertaining to program evolution and development

Profile of the ideal candidate

- Master's degree in social sciences or acceptable equivalent
- Registered member of the applicable college in Ontario and is eligible to practice independently in Ontario
- 2 years minimum experience in delivering Emotionally Focussed Therapy, or a willingness to participate in training for EFT
- Demonstratable knowledge of best practices with regard to couple's work
- Crisis intervention skills, with well-developed problem-solving abilities and interpersonal skills
- Demonstrated competence working with couples who are experiencing distress in their relationship
- Ability to tend to themes of diversity and anti-oppression
